Protection of your personal data

This privacy statement provides information about the processing and the protection of your personal data.

Processing operation:
European Development Days 2021 and other related events

Data Controller: European Commission, Directorate-General for International Partnerships (INTPA)/ Political Strategy and Communication (INTPA.DG.02)

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1. Introduction

The European Commission is committed to protect your personal data and to respect your privacy. The Commission collects and further processes personal data pursuant to [Regulation \(EU\) 2018/1725](#) of the European Parliament and of the Council on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data by the Union institutions, bodies, offices and agencies and on the free movement of such data.

This privacy statement explains the reason for the processing of your personal data in the context of European Development Days. It explains the way we collect, handle and ensure protection of all personal data provided, how that information is used and what rights you have in relation to your personal data. It also specifies the contact details of the responsible Data Controller with whom you may exercise your rights, the Data Protection Officer and the European Data Protection Supervisor.

The information in relation to processing operation of data for the registration to the fourteenth edition of the European Development Days, undertaken by the Directorate-General for International Partnerships (INTPA)/ Political Strategy and Communication (INTPA.DG.02) of the European Commission, is presented below.

2. Why and how do we process your personal data?

Purpose of the processing operation:

► Creation of a profile on the EDD website (to submit a proposal when the call is open (April/May) or to subscribe to the EDD mailing list for updates regarding the organisation of the EDD and its subsequent editions.

► Registration to participate in the EDD event

All sessions will be live streamed and recorded for replays on a dedicated platform. However, participants will not appear on screen unless they actively choose to intervene and are invited to do so. Presentations, live web streaming and audio and video recording of speakers and participants could be published in the context of the meeting and/or for communication and promotion purposes in the framework of European Commission activities. In the registration form, an opt-out is provided to participants who prefer their images not to be recorded.

Your personal data will not be used for any automated decision-making including profiling.

3. On what legal ground(s) do we process your personal data?

The processing operations on personal data, linked to the organisation, management, follow-up and promotion of the event (including web-streaming, photos, audio-visual recording) are necessary for the management and functioning of the Commission, as mandated by the Treaties. Those provisions are in particular, Article 11 of the Treaty on European Union and Article 15 of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union. Consequently, those processing operations are lawful under Article 5(1)(a) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 (processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority vested in the Union institution or body).

The processing operations on personal data of the speakers for the European Development Days with whom a contract is concluded, are carried out in line with the contractual provisions. Consequently,

that processing is necessary and lawful under Article 5(1)(c) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 (processing is necessary for the performance of a contract to which the data subject is party or in order to take steps at the request of the data subject prior to entering into a contract).

Your consent is required for:

- ▶ The processing of your personal data relating to your access requirements;
- ▶ The sharing of the European Development Days 2021 participants list containing your name and affiliation with other participants, in order to create working groups that collaborate during the meeting/event and facilitate match-making between participants;
- ▶ The sharing of the meeting/event attendee list containing your name and affiliation among participants, in order to create working groups to continue the collaborate work launched during the meeting/event;
- ▶ The processing of your personal data for inviting you to future events the data controller may organise;
- ▶ The processing of your personal data for managing your subscription to a newsletter of the data controller.

If you opt-in, you are giving us your explicit consent under Article 5(1)(d) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 to process your personal data for those specific purposes. You can give your consent via a clear affirmative act by ticking the box(es) on the online registration form.

4. Which personal data do we collect and further process?

The following personal data will be processed:

- ▶ Contact details (gender, title, function / job title, first name, last name, organisation, e-mail address, date of birth, picture, nationality, region, organisation and organisation category);
- ▶ Social medias and topics of interest may be collected.
- ▶ For the press only, press card and the name of the media they work for.

5. How long do we keep your personal data?

The Data Controller only keeps your personal data for the time necessary to fulfil the purpose of collection or further processing. For each of the categories of personal data that is processed, please find below the retention details and the reference to the relevant record of processing:

- ▶ All personal data related to the organisation and management of the event (this includes the information given during the registration, before, during or after the event) will be deleted **one year** after the last action in relation to the event.
- ▶ Recordings from the web-streamed event will be kept for **2 years** before being deleted. More information is available in the Record of Processing DPR-EC-00306 (Web-streaming of Commission events).
- ▶ In case of audio-visual recording of the event, the recordings will be kept for **3 months** after the event before being deleted. More information is available in the Record of Processing DPR-EC-01937 (Audio-visual recording of meetings).
- ▶ Personal data shared with the controller for future mailing purposes (e.g., for receiving newsletters or invitations to similar events) are processed in line with the Record of Processing.
- ▶ Selected service providers for organisational purposes are contractually bound to process personal data on behalf of and in line with the instructions of the data controller, keep confidential any data they process and protect it from unauthorised access, use and retention.

6. How do we protect and safeguard your personal data?

All personal data in electronic format (e-mails, documents, databases, uploaded batches of data, etc.) are stored either on the servers of the European Commission or of its contractors. All processing operations are carried out pursuant to [Commission Decision \(EU, Euratom\) 2017/46](#) of 10 January 2017 on the security of communication and information systems in the European Commission.

The Commission's contractors are bound by a specific contractual clause for any processing operations of your personal data on behalf of the Commission, and by the confidentiality obligations deriving from the General Data Protection Regulation ('GDPR' - [Regulation \(EU\) 2016/679](#))

In order to protect your personal data, the Commission has put in place a number of technical and organisational measures. Technical measures include appropriate actions to address online security, risk of data loss, alteration of data or unauthorised access, taking into consideration the risk presented by the processing and the nature of the personal data being processed. Organisational measures include restricting access to the personal data solely to authorised persons with a legitimate need to know for the purposes of this processing operation.

7. Who has access to your personal data and to whom is it disclosed?

Access to your personal data is provided to the Commission staff responsible for carrying out this processing operation and to other authorised Commission staff according to the "need to know" principle. Such staff abide by statutory, and when required, additional confidentiality agreements.

Where necessary, we may also share your information with service providers for the purposes of organising the event: Service provider 1: S.A. VO GROUP
Personal data will also be shared with the selected video conference provider that will be chosen for the implementation of the virtual events.

Pictures and video recordings will be used for communications purposes on the EDD website and the EDD social media (Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, YouTube) as well as for the Community guide.

Cookies

Cookies are short text files stored on a user's device (such as a computer, tablet or phone) by a website. Cookies are used for the technical functioning of a website (functional cookies) or for gathering statistics (analytical cookies).

Enabling these cookies is not strictly necessary for the website to work but it will provide you with a better browsing experience. You can delete or block these cookies, but if you do that, some features of the meeting/event website may not work as intended.

The cookie-related information is not used to identify data subjects personally. These cookies are not used for any purpose other than those described here.

Data for Statistics purposes

We use Google Analytics to better understand website traffic and webpage usage.

What data do we collect?

Audience (Geography, language, device, operating system, anonymised IP address, returning vs new visitors).

Behaviour (Clicks, page views, average time spent on website, bounce rate).

Third party IT tools, including Social Media

We use third party IT tools to inform about and promote the event through widely used communication channels, including social media. For detailed information about the use of social media by the European Commission, see the Record of Processing DPR-EC-00073 (Social Media Use by the European Commission).

You can watch our videos, which we also upload to our International Partnerships Facebook, Twitter, Instagram page and follow links from our website to International Partnerships social media channels.

In order to protect your privacy, our use of third party IT tools to connect to those services does not set cookies when our website pages are loaded on your computer (or other devices), nor are you immediately redirected to those social media or other websites. Only in the event that you click on a button or "play" on a video to watch it, a cookie of the social media company concerned will be installed on your device. If you do not click on any social media buttons or videos, no cookies will be installed on your device by third parties.

In order to view such third-party content on our websites, a message will alert you that you need to accept those third parties' specific Terms and Conditions, including their cookie policies, over which the Commission has no control.

We recommend that users read the relevant privacy policies of [Twitter](#), [Facebook](#) and [Instagram](#) carefully before using them. These explain each company's policy of personal data collection and further processing, their use of data, users' rights and the ways in which users can protect their privacy when using those services.

The use of a third party IT tool does not in any way imply that the European Commission endorses them or their privacy policies. In the event that one or more third party IT tools are occasionally unavailable, we accept no responsibility for lack of service due to their downtime.

8. What are your rights and how can you exercise them?

You have specific rights as a 'data subject' under Chapter III (Articles 14-25) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725, in particular the right to access, your personal data and to rectify them in case your personal data are inaccurate or incomplete. Where applicable, you have the right to erase your personal data, to restrict the processing of your personal data, to object to the processing, and the right to data portability.

You have the right to object to the processing of your personal data, which is lawfully carried out pursuant to Article 5(1)(a) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 on grounds relating to your particular situation.

You have consented to provide your personal data to the data controller for the present processing operation. You can withdraw your consent at any time by notifying the data controller at community@eudevdays.eu. The withdrawal of your consent will not affect the lawfulness of the processing carried out before you have withdrawn the consent.

You can exercise your rights by contacting the data controller, or in case of conflict the Data Protection Officer. If necessary, you can also address the European Data Protection Supervisor. Their contact information is given under Heading 9 below.

Where you wish to exercise your rights in the context of one or several specific processing operations, please provide their description (i.e. their Record reference(s) as specified under Heading 10 below) in your request.
